With more than 35-years of civil engineering experience, Jim Grossi has designed, and entitled and provided engineering consulting services on numerous projects in Northern California for public, educational, institutional, and private clients. Recent projects include the Civil Engineering Master Plan work at Solano CCD, as well as projects for UC Davis Medical Center, Clark Kerr Campus Renovation at UC Berkeley, UCSF Mission Bay, College of Marin, San Mateo CCD, Foothill-De Anza CCD, and Peralta CCD.
